

## Read all instructions before using

When using any machine, basic safety precautions should always be taken, including the following: Read all instructions before using.

## WARNING: To reduce the risk of burns, fire, electric shock, or injury to persons:

- The Pro-Stitcher Lite robotic system should never be left unattended when plugged in. Always unplug the machine from the electric outlet immediately after using and before cleaning.
- Do not allow to be used as a toy. Close attention is necessary when Pro-Stitcher Lite is used by or near children.
- Use this system only for its intended use as described in this manual. Use only attachments recommended by the manufacturer as contained in this manual.
- Never operate this system if it has a damaged cord or plug, if it is not working properly, if it has been dropped or damaged, or dropped into water. Return the system to the nearest authorized dealer or service center for examination, repair, electrical or mechanical adjustment.
- Never operate the system with any air openings blocked. Keep ventilation openings of the system free from the accumulation of lint, dust, and loose cloth.
- Never drop or insert any object into any opening.
- Do not use outdoors.
- Do not operate where aerosol (spray) products are being used or where oxygen is being administered.
- To disconnect, shut down the tablet, then shut down the machine and unplug from power source.
- Do not unplug by pulling on cord. To unplug, grasp the plug, not the cord.

### Read these instructions before using the machine

#### To use the system safely

- 1. Keep hands and loose clothing away from wheels, gears or other moving parts.
- 2. Turn the system off and unplug the cord in the following cases:
  - when you have stopped using the machine
  - when you replace or remove the quilting machine needle or any other part
  - in case of failure when you use the system
  - when you check or clean the machine
  - when you leave the system unattended
- 3. Connect the machine directly to the wall outlet. Do not use extension cords.

### To increase the life of your system

- 1. Do not store this system in areas exposed to direct sunlight or high humidity. Never use or store the system near a heater, an iron, a halogen lamp or other hot things.
- 2. Clean the tablet screen with a soft, lint-free rag. If necessary, dampen the rag with a small amount of isopropyl alcohol. Do not use any other cleaners on the tablet screen.
- 3. Use only neutral soaps or detergents to clean the carriage. Benzene, solvents and scouring powders can damage the machine and therefore should never be used.
- 4. Do not drop or bump the system.
- 5. Always consult the manual to replace or fix any other part of the system.

#### To repair or adjust the system

- If the system malfunctions or needs adjustment, first check the troubleshooting chart in the appendix to inspect and adjust the system yourself.
- If unable to fix, contact your local retailer.

### **Machine Packaging Information**

If you do not pack the system properly or if you do not use the correct packaging materials, the system could be damaged. Pro-Stitcher is not liable for damage that occurs during return shipping.

## **Recommended Use and Storage**

- 1. It is recommended that our products be operated within in a temperature range of 60°F to 90°F.
- 2. Store products in a climate-controlled environment with the following provisions:
  - · Store machine in the original packaging, which contains the internal supports designed specifically to maintain and protect the machine during transport or storage.
  - Detach cables and accessories before packing.
  - To best protect your electronics, store them in the original packaging, especially any that arrived in antistatic containers.
- 3. Storage or use in an environment other than what is recommended may result in
  - Damaging condensation
  - Rust
  - Premature wear
  - Overheating
  - Poor performance
  - Shortened battery life
- 4. The tablet warranty, if applicable, is VOID if the tablet is stored in temperatures below 32°F or above 110°F. Do not leave the tablet in a vehicle or other enclosed space where the temperature may exceed 110°F.
- 5. If the product is stored at a temperature above or below the recommended operating range, allow the machine to acclimate to the operating environment before use.

### **Low Power Protection Mode**

FOR CHUWI BRAND TABLETS ONLY—If the battery of the tablet is left uncharged for a long time, it will enter a power protection mode. At this time, when you plug in the tablet to charge, there will be no battery icon prompt, and the tablet will not turn on immediately.

To turn on and charge your tablet normally again, follow these instructions:

- 1. Plug in the charger to the tablet.
- 2. Press and hold the power button on the tablet for 15 seconds.
- 3. Confirm that the LED light turns red.
- 4. Charge the tablet for at least 1 hour.
- 5. Power on the tablet as normal.
  - NOTE: The above instructions may not apply to your particular Pro-Stitcher tablet. If you cannot solve the issue following these instructions, please contact Pro-Stitcher's technical support.

## Installing the Pro-Stitcher Lite Assembly on the **Coronet Machine**

These instructions are for installing Pro-Stitcher Lite on the Coronet machine and Coronet Frame. Pro-Stitcher recommends installation by an authorized Pro-Stitcher retailer if available.


#### **Tools required**

- Power drill
- 2.5mm hex wrench
- 3mm hex wrench
- 4mm hex wrench
- 5mm hex wrench
- 9/16-inch open-end wrench
- 5/16-inch nutdriver (optional)
- Slotted screwdrivers (one large and one small)
- Phillips screwdrivers (one large and one small)

## **Installing the Pro-Stitcher Lite Tray Assembly**

These instructions are for installing the Pro-Stitcher Lite Tray Assembly.


- 1. Locate the Pro-Stitcher Lite tray assembly, screws, and washers (see Parts List, item E).
- 2. Place the 4-wheel Coronet carriage and encoder (see Parts List, item V) upside down on a protected flat surface with the wheels up toward the ceiling.
- 3. Use the 3mm hex tool to remove and discard the six screws and washers, which are located in the inside inserts holding the track supports to the top of the carriage as shown.
  - **⇒ IMPORTANT**: There will still be two inside screws close together on each end of the track support holding the tracks in position and in place on the carriage at this point. Do not remove these screws. They are keeping the tracks aligned in position.




- 4. Place the Pro-Stitcher Lite tray assembly (see Parts List, item E) onto the 4-wheel Coronet carriage and encoder, and place the one new longer screw and washer into the inside insert (location circled in the image). Note the position of the longer circled screw and washer. It goes through an additional layer of metal bracket requiring it to be longer.
- 5. Fasten the tray with the five remaining new screws and washers into the inside screw inserts where you originally removed the old screws.


### Install the Y-Rack

- 1. Carefully lay the quilting machine on its left side as shown (looking from the front).
  - ⇒ IMPORTANT: Take care not to put any undue weight or pressure on the machine encoder, which is circled. You may want to carefully place the two bottom wheels just off the front edge of the table, with a second person holding the machine.
- 2. Locate the Y-rack (see Parts List, item H) and two mounting screws (see Parts List, item I) for the Coronet machine.



- 3. Attach the Y-Rack to the bottom of the front and rear base plates with the two mounting screws. Orient the blue Flexirack toward the middle of the machine; the bolt inserts should be toward the outside. Use a flat screwdriver or 5/16-inch nut driver to tighten the two screws.
  - **NOTE**: The two larger inserts in the Y-rack are used to fasten it to the machine.
  - △ **CAUTION**: Be careful not to overtighten the screws as the base plate inserts will strip easily.





## **Frame Assembly**

If you have not already assembled the Coronet frame, you will need to do so now. Use the assembly instructions provided with the frame to assemble the frame.

### 4-Wheel Track System


On the Coronet frame, you will need to change the tracks from the 8-wheel system to the 4-wheel system.

Use the 4-wheel Track System assembly instructions to install the track system. The instructions come with the 4-Wheel Track system but are also included on page 16.



### Replace the 8-Wheel Track with the 4-Wheel Track


- 1. Remove the 8-wheel track supports already installed on the table top. Remove the three large flange head screws holding each of the front and rear eight-wheel track supports in place from the bottom side of the table top.
  - NOTE: The 4mm hex wrench that is required to remove these screws was provided in the original frame kit. These track supports will not be needed for the four-wheel carriage and may be discarded. The six flange head screws will be reused; DO NOT DISCARD THEM.
- 2. Install the front and rear four-wheel track assemblies, using the flange head screws saved in step 1 from the underside of the table. Leave the six screws loose for now.
  - NOTE: The front four-wheel track assembly is narrower than the rear four-wheel track assembly. The bent lip goes to the outside of the table top on each of the assemblies.




## **Installation on the Coronet Frame**

## **Installing the Flexirack Mount**


- 1. Remove the button-head screws holding the track support to the front white adapter rail base and set them aside; they will not be reused.
- 2. Place the Flexirack mount (see Parts List, item T) over the track and align the screw inserts. Place the new socketed flat head screws through the mount, through the track support, and into the threaded inserts in the white adapter rail base.
  - NOTE: The track is sandwiched between the Flexirack mount and the white adapter rail base.
- 3. Align the two pieces of the mount to be straight with each other and tighten the socketed flat head screws firmly.






### Align the Tracks to the Carriage

- 1. Place the four-wheel carriage on the tracks. Ensure the distance between the front and rear tracks is correct and consistent for the wheels. Move the carriage along the track and slide the tracks closer or further apart as needed.
- 2. Once you have confirmed the tracks fit into the carriage wheels, leave the carriage on the tracks, push the carriage and tracks as far to the back as possible, align the back track straight across the rear of the frame, and fully tighten the back track screws.
- 3. Roll the carriage to one end and ensure the tracks are aligned the correct distance apart and fully tighten the front screws.
- 4. Repeat this process for the center and end screws at the front.
  - NOTE: All screws should now be tightened, and the machine should roll freely down the track without any resistance. If not, adjust the distance between the tracks until the carriage rides freely along the track.
  - **IMPORTANT**: A coarse adjustment is made with the large flange head screws from the underside of the table. A fine adjustment is made with the socketed flat head screws on top with the 2.5mm hex wrench. (See page 21 for more information.)





### Install the X-Rack on the Coronet Frame

Locate the blue 10-foot Flexirack (see Parts List, item B) and your carriage with the Pro-Stitcher Lite tray assembly (see Parts List, item E) mounted.


- NOTE: Unroll and straighten the blue Flexirack, allowing it to relax so it will be easier to lay it onto the table top.
- **IMPORTANT**: Looking at the bottom side of the tray/carriage assembly, ensure the black discs are in the engaged position. The black discs are engaged when the round parts are on the X and Y levers. The black discs are disengaged when the flat part is on the levers. Rotate the discs by hand as needed to engage them with the gears.
- 1. Place the carriage on the frame tracks with the carriage encoder and power cord receptacle at the rear of the frame.


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



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










- 2. Starting at one end of the table, begin mounting the blue Flexirack to the Flexirack mount at the front of the table while aligning it to the front black gear on the Pro-Stitcher Lite assembly carriage. Ensure the blue Flexirack is close enough to the table top edge to be secured by the clamps and screws into the predrilled and tapped inserts in the mount.
- 3. Peel back a few inches of the pink protective layer of the tape. Position the blue Flexirack by aligning it to the black gear as you move down the table. Press down on the blue Flexirack to stick it firmly to the Flexirack mount.






- 4. Align the blue Flexirack with the black gear along the length of the table. While moving across the length of the table, remove the pink protective layer a little at a time and press downward on the blue Flexirack.
- 5. Double-check the alignment of the carriage black gear with the blue Flexirack by rolling the carriage along the entire length of the table. Adjust as necessary to ensure the Flexirack and the gear are aligned.
- 6. Trim the Flexirack to length using a knife or wire cutters. Ensure that the blue Flexirack is close to the end of the table top so the clamps will secure it to the mount's predrilled and tapped inserts.
  - **□ IMPORTANT**: On the Coronet frame, you will have enough spare blue Flexirack for a second X-rack. Set the extra piece in a safe place in case you ever need to replace the blue Flexirack.
- 7. At both ends of the blue Flexirack, use two of the small metal clamps (see Parts List, item C) to hold the ends firmly in place. The clamps have an insert through the center and a bent lip on one end. The lip should be on the side opposite of the blue Flexirack.
- 8. Use a Phillips screwdriver to fasten the clamps on both ends of the Flexirack to the Flexirack mount.









## Verify the Alignment

- 1. Place the Pro-Stitcher Lite carriage on the frame with the power cord connection and encoder toward the back of the frame. Carefully lift the Coronet quilting machine and place it on the carriage so the wheels engage the black carriage tracks, making sure not to set the wheels on top of the encoder cables. This is easier to do with two people, one at each end of the quilting machine.
- 2. Verify that the black Y-axis gear engages the blue Flexirack for the Y-axis at the front and the rear of the Y-rack. To do this, look from the back of the machine between the bottom of the quilting machine and the top of the carriage. If necessary, use your hand to rotate the lifting cam eccentrics until the gears are engaged. This will need to be done on the underside of the carriage before it is placed onto the frame.
- 3. Ensure that at least two-thirds of the black y-axis gear and blue Flexirack are interlocking the entire length of the rack. Some horizontal adjustments may be necessary. If so, loosen the two screws that mount the Y-axis bracket to the base plates and push the bracket in the necessary direction, hold it in place, and then retighten the screws.
  - NOTE: The screws can be adjusted with the quilting machine on the carriage. Pull the machine to the front to access the front screws and to the rear to access the rear screws.
- 4. Pull the quilting machine to the rear of the carriage and ensure the rear of the Y-axis bracket does not collide with the black plastic track retainer on the rear of the carriage. Adjust the Y-bracket if needed.




## **Set Up Pro-Stitcher Lite**

- **IMPORTANT**: If necessary, use your hand to engage the black gears before placing the machine on the carriage. (See page 20 for more information.)
- 1. Plug one end of the machine encoder (Y) cable into the connector on the back of the machine marked Y and the other into the machine encoder (see figure 1).
- 2. Plug one end of the carriage encoder (X) cable into the connector at the back of the machine marked X and the other end into the carriage encoder (see figure 1).
- 3. Plug the small special connector machine communication cable (see Parts List, item Q) into the top of the adapter cover labeled PSL at the back of the machine. The other end will plug into the bottom of the transition box (see Parts List, item S) at the front of the machine after attaching the bracket (see figure 2).
- 4. Plug the communication cable (see Parts List, item P) connector into the back of the Pro-Stitcher Lite carriage and the other end into the bottom of the transition box at the front of the machine (see figure 2).
- 5. Plug the power cord into the back of the Pro-Stitcher Lite carriage (see figure 2).
  - IMPORTANT: Do not plug the power cord into the wall outlet until all connections are completed.









### **Attach the Cable Clip Mounts**

Some of the cords you attach run from the back of the machine to the front of the machine where the transition box and tablet will be added. To ensure that the cords stay in place, add the cable clip mounts (see Parts List, item R) to your machine.

- NOTE: For the placement of each cable clip mount, see the included photos. One clip mount should be placed on the side of the machine near the back, and the remaining three clips should be along the top of the machine. Take special care to keep the clips and cables away from the thread mast.
- 1. To expose the adhesive, remove the backing from the flat side of the cable clip mount.
- 2. Place and hold the cable clip mount on the machine in place for several seconds to ensure that it adheres properly.
- 3. Repeat the steps for each cable clip.
- 4. When each cable clip is in place, slightly and gently lift each clip to slide the cables inside. Minimize the slack between each cable clip as much as possible to ensure the cables will be able to reach the transition box.
- 5. Now that the cables are secured, ensure that the quilting machine can move in both the X (left/right) and Y (front/back) directions and that the corresponding gears are rotating as well.








### Attach the Tablet to the Machine

#### Attach the tablet bracket


1. Remove the 3 front handlebar screws. These screws will be reused, so make sure you do not lose or discard them.



2. Install the special adapter (see Parts List, item R) to the front of the machine where you removed the front handlebar using the three screws you removed in step 1 above. Place the screws through the adapter, through the handlebar bracket, and into the machine. Tighten the screws firmly with a hex wrench.



3. Fasten the tablet bracket assembly (see Parts List, item F) to the adapter with three flanged button head screws (see Parts List, item G) and tighten firmly with a 2.5mm hex tool.



#### Attaching the transition box to the bracket


1. Remove the bracket knob and washer. Hold the bolt into the bracket and place the transition box bracket, washer and knob onto the bolt. Hand tighten the knob.


2. Insert the end of the zip tie from front to back through the bracket and transition box and then back through the box and bracket to the front.

3. Put the end through the locking head of the zip tie. Pull the zip tie tight and trim off the end with scissors or wire cutters.

### Connecting the communication cables to the transition box


- 1. Looking at the back of the transition box, you'll see two cable ports at the bottom of the box.
- 2. Plug the larger communication cable (see Parts List, item P) into the 9-pin port at the bottom of the transition box.
- 3. Tighten the connectors on the bottom of the cable after the cable has been plugged in.
- 4. Plug the smaller communication cable (see Parts List, item Q) into the USB port at the bottom of the transition box.






#### Attaching the tablet to the Coronet machine

- 1. Loosen the knob on the back of the tablet mount and raise the top of the mount.
- 2. Tilt the tablet (see Parts List, item M) out slightly at the top and snap it down into the lower mount tabs, then tilt back.
- 3. Lower the top of the mount down onto the tablet until the mount top tabs snap onto the tablet and tighten the knob firmly by hand.
- 4. Ensure the tablet is held securely in the mount, if not repeat step 3 and press the top of the mount down onto the tablet before tightening the knob.
- 5. Plug in the power cable (see Parts List, item J) from the transition box and into the right side of the tablet. Be sure the cable is plugged into the power jack (right side), not the headphone jack (left side).
- 6. Plug the USB cable (see Parts List, item L) into the transition box and into the left side of the tablet.





## Power On and Shut Down Pro-Stitcher Lite

Check that the power cord is plugged into the power supply located at the back of the carriage and into an operational wall power outlet. The tablet power connection will be plugged into the transition box.

NOTE: If the power cable is unplugged from the Coronet machine or outlet, the tablet will continue to run on battery power until the charge has been used up.

### Power on Pro-Stitcher Lite

- Press the power switch on the Pro-Stitcher Lite carriage.
- Press the power switch on the Coronet.
- Press the power switch on the tablet.

### Shut Down Pro-Stitcher Lite

- Choose the File Tab. Then choose the Shut Down button. Choose Shut Down from the drop-down menu. This shuts down both the Pro-Stitcher Lite software and the tablet.
- Press the machine power switch off.
- Press the Pro-Stitcher Lite carriage power switch off.
- **□ IMPORTANT**: If you don't see the Shut Down button, press the power switch on the tablet computer to continue shutting down the Pro-Stitcher Lite computer.
- IMPORTANT: If you leave the Pro-Stitcher Lite tablet powered on with the power cord unplugged, the tablet will begin running off battery power. The tablet will shut down when no battery power remains.
- **→ IMPORTANT**: If the Pro-Stitcher Lite computer is left on for a long period of time, the screen may turn black and enter a sleep mode. Tap the screen to turn on the screen again. It may be necessary to drag a finger upward on the start-up screen to access Pro-Stitcher Lite.

## Care for the Pro-Stitcher Lite Tablet

The Pro-Stitcher tablet is what powers your Pro-Stitcher system. To help extend the life of your tablet, please follow the tips listed below:

### Keep your tablet at room temperature. Avoid high or low temperatures.

- For best tablet performance, keep your tablet in environments between 50° and 80° Fahrenheit.
- Tablet batteries are easily and quickly weakened in unfavorable temperature conditions.
- When your tablet overheats, it may weaken its battery life. Do not keep your tablet in a hot car or other hot locations.
- Charging the tablet at lower temperatures will lead to longer charging times. Charging the tablet at higher temperatures will have an adverse impact on the battery's performance.

### Keep your battery between 40% and 80% for the best longevity results.

Do not keep your longarm machine powered on when it is not in use. Your tablet charges when your longarm is turned on. Turn your longarm off when you are not using it to help maintain your tablet's battery life.

### If the tablet is stored for an extended period, check the charge every 2-3 months and recharge the battery before use.

- Turn on your tablet on every 2–3 months to check the battery level. This can be done by turning on your tablet only (not the longarm machine), selecting Cancel when the Pro-Stitcher pop-up appears, and looking at the battery icon in the lower-right corner of the tablet screen.
- If the battery is charged at 50% or less, connect the tablet to a power source, either by turning on the longarm machine or connecting the tablet to the wall charger. For best results, use only the charger that came with your tablet.

#### Don't drain your tablet's battery daily.

Do not deplete the battery to the point where your tablet shuts down or hibernates automatically. If you completely drain your tablet's battery daily, you will notice a slight reduction in its ability to hold a charge. To avoid this, keep the tablet connected to your longarm machine.

#### Remember the battery life should be 2-5 years.

Batteries lose capacity over time, regardless of whether they are used or in storage. After five years, the battery chemistry can become unstable. Using the tablet beyond this range is not recommended.

#### Look for signs of a worn-out battery.

- The tablet shuts down, stating a low battery when it should have plenty of runtime left.
- The battery percentage meter drops randomly.
- Charging finishes prematurely, even though the battery did not accept much power.
- Sudden power capacity drops without warning.
- The self-discharge rate soars and is often uneven.
- The battery gets very hot during charging. (Sometimes the charger shuts down due to this.)
- The battery starts bulging.

If your tablet is running slowly, is constantly running on a low battery, is showing signs of wear, or was purchased more than 5 years ago, you may want to think about replacing your tablet.

## **Getting Started with Pro-Stitcher Lite**

### To move the quilting machine after the software has loaded

• To move the guilting machine after the software has loaded, the motors should be unlocked. Press the Motors button in the upper-right corner of the screen (Lock icon) to unlock the motors. Note that the button changes from a closed lock to an open lock.

### To move the machine for free-motion quilting

- Choose the Pro-Stitcher tab and then the Gears button. The Gears icon is orange when the gears are engaged. The Gears icon is purple with a line through it when the gears are disengaged. Pro-Stitcher Lite automatically moves the carriage gears away from the Flexirack to disengage. Touch the Gears button to engage the gears and use Pro-Stitcher Lite for computerized quilting.
- NOTE: When the gears are engaged, you can still move the machine, but it will feel a bit stiff. If you wish to free motion quilt, where you—not the Pro-Stitcher Lite—are moving the machine, disengage the gears for smoother movement. The gears must be engaged for computerized quilting.


### To use the USB flash drive

- A USB flash drive is included with the Pro-Stitcher Lite and is preloaded with designs. These designs have also been loaded to the drive on the tablet computer, so the USB flash drive is the backup copy of the designs.
- IMPORTANT: It is not necessary to power down Pro-Stitcher Lite to install or remove the USB flash drive, but take care not to remove the flash drive while the system is saving to or loading from the drive.

## **Update the Pro-Stitcher Lite Software**

Pro-Stitcher would like to make sure your software is always up to date. Here are the steps to take to ensure you have the latest version of Pro-Stitcher Lite:

- 1. In the Pro-Stitcher Lite software, select the "i" icon in the upper right-hand corner of the screen. This is the information screen.
- 2. On the left-hand side of the screen, select the "About" button to display the information. A pop-up will show you what version of Pro-Stitcher Lite you have.



- 3. On a separate computer with an Internet connection, go to https://prostitcher.com/prostitchersoftware-update/. Compare the latest version number here with the version number installed on your tablet. If your version is the most recent, you are ready to quilt. If you do not have the latest version installed, proceed with the following directions.
  - IMPORTANT: The Pro-Stitcher tablet should not be connected to the Internet. Establishing an Internet connection may cause the tablet operating system to update, and Pro-Stitcher Lite may not work properly after that.

### **Downloading the Updated Pro-Stitcher Lite Software Version**

Tools required: USB drive

**NOTE**: Use the USB port on the tablet that is not being used.

- 1. Insert a USB drive into the USB port of the computer connected to the Internet.
- 2. In a browser window, navigate to the Pro-Stitcher website: https://prostitcher.com/prostitcher-software-update/
- 3. Select Download to download the most recent version compatible with your tablet. The zip file will be saved to the Downloads folder on your computer.
- 4. Locate the PSUpdate[Version#].zip folder. Right-click the folder name and select Extract All to unzip the update file.
- 5. Copy the unzipped PSUpdate. [Version#]. exe file from the folder to the USB drive.
  - **NOTE**: The higher the version number, the more up-to-date the version is.
- 6. After the file is copied to the USB drive, safely remove the USB drive from the computer and plug it into the open USB port on the Pro-Stitcher Lite tablet.


Check for a new software version every few weeks and update your Pro-Stitcher Lite software as needed.

### **Updating Pro-Stitcher Lite on the Tablet**

- 1. Insert the USB drive into the USB port on the Pro-Stitcher tablet. On the Pro-Stitcher Lite screen, select File and then Update.
- 2. Pro-Stitcher Lite will automatically show all updates saved on the USB drive. Select the update you wish to install, and then select Run.




- 3. Select Start when the Pro-Stitcher Lite update screen appears.
- 4. If prompted, select the type of Baby Lock machine you have and press Next.



- 5. Select **Confirm** to continue.
  - NOTE: If prompted, follow steps 6 through 13. Otherwise, proceed to step 14.
- 6. When the Visual C++ Redistributable installer appears, select the "I agree" box and then select Install.








- 8. Wait for up to several minutes for the next step to finish.
- 9. Mark the "I have read..." box and select Install to begin installing the .NET 4.6.1 Framework files required for Pro-Stitcher Lite.
  - ➡ IMPORTANT: If the .NET installer indicates that you a have more current version, close the message box and continue to follow the on-screen instructions to complete Pro-Stitcher Lite installation. Reboot the tablet when it is finished.
- 10. Wait until the installation finishes. This may take several minutes.

11. If you receive a message asking you to close some programs, select No.



- 13. When prompted to restart the computer, select Restart Later.
- 14. When you see the "Installation Completed" message, press the Close button.

- 15. When the pop-up screen closes, the Pro-Stitcher Lite software will automatically start.
- 16. Shut down the tablet. To do this, select File, Shut Down, and then Shut Down. To restart the tablet from the Windows desktop, access the taskbar and select the Power icon, and then select Shut Down. Next, turn off the quilting machine and Pro-Stitcher Lite carriage. Keep everything off for at least 1–2 minutes after an update. To complete the installation process, turn on the carriage, the machine, and the tablet again.

# **Troubleshooting**

Problem/Symptom	Corrective Measure
No display on the touchscreen monitor	
	The Pro-Stitcher Lite tablet computer is powered off. Press the <b>Power</b> button of the tablet to turn it on.
	There is no power to the tablet computer. Ensure the power cord to the Pro-Stitcher Lite is plugged into the transition box and the machine is plugged into a powered outlet. Check the connections of all the power cords to the machine. If all cables are plugged in properly, press the <b>Power</b> button on the monitor.
The stitch regulator cable is not connected property	perly
Pro-Stitcher Lite moves but does not stitch.	Check that all cables are securely attached.
	Verify the Pro-Stitcher Lite tablet and the quilting machine are communicating with each other. Choose the <b>Settings</b> tab, and then press the <b>Advanced</b> button. From the drop-down menu, choose <b>Communications</b> . On the sidebar to the right, choose <b>Reconnect Machine</b> . If the two systems are communicating, pressing the <b>Pro-Stitcher tab</b> and then the <b>Full Stitch</b> or <b>Half Stitch</b> icons will result in the quilting machine's needle performing that function.
Pro-Stitcher Lite stitches, but the stitch lengths vary, and the quilting machine slows down or even stops in some directions.	The problem can be narrowed to a specific encoder wheel by running the quilting machine manually.  Start the quilting machine from the handlebars in Stitch Regulated mode, and only move the machine left and right. Then try only moving front and back. If the quilting machine stops stitching while moving front and back, then the problem is with the encoder mounted to the back of the machine. If it stops stitching while moving left and right, then the problem is with the encoder on the carriage. Make sure the encoder wheels roll on the tracks when moving the quilting machine and that the stitch regulator cable is plugged in securely to the encoders.

## **Problem/Symptom**

### **Corrective Measure**

### The black gears do not engage the blue Flexirack

When the quilting machine is pushed by hand, the horizontal and/or vertical crosshair lines do not move.

Make sure the black gears fully engage the blue Flexirack.

### The X- and/or Y-axis gears are only partially engaged

Stitched designs appear jagged or wobbly. The system may be skipping teeth when running, resulting in a shifting of the design on the quilt.

With the Pro-Stitcher Lite powered and the motors engaged and enabled (locked in position), pressing the machine side to side or front to back allows a little motion, but the black gear does not rotate.

If there is motion in the X-axis (left/right), check the X-axis gear assembly and make sure nothing is preventing the assembly from springing downward and putting pressure on the blue rack. If the motion is in the Y-axis (front/back), make sure the blue rack and the black gear are properly aligned and adjust if necessary by loosening the two Y-axis bracket mounting screws and shifting the Y-axis bracket left/right and retightening the screws. If the black gear is not pressing upward enough on the blue rack to fully engage the gears, it may be necessary to install shim washers between the quilting machine base-plates and the Y-axis bracket to drop the bracket a little.

### One or more of the pulleys/gears on the X- or Y-axis assemblies are loose

Stitched designs appear jagged or wobbly.

With the Pro-Stitcher Lite powered and motors engaged and enabled (locked in position), pressing the machine side to side or front to back allows a little motion, and the black gear does rotate.

Monitor the motor assembly while engaged and enabled to determine which gear or pulley is slipping. It will most likely be either the gear mounted directly to the motor shaft or the gear mounted to the shaft that drives the black gear. For help making adjustments, contact your retailer.

### Lubrication required between black gears and blue Flexirack

When the Pro-Stitcher Lite carriage levers are engaged, squeaking can be heard as the machine is pushed or driven.

Lubricate the teeth of the black plastic gears for both the X- and the Y-axes by applying a small amount of silicone lubricant to the teeth of the black gears. Do not use a solvent-based or an oil-based lubricant (such as WD-40 or sewing machine oil), as this will attract dust and eventually clog the gears.

## **Problem/Symptom**

### **Corrective Measure**

### Positioning a pattern using the Reset Home button

When the **Reset Home** button is pressed, the pattern is not positioned properly.

The Reset Home button is not intended to be used as a repositioning tool. Reset Home simply makes the current needle position match up with the "X=0, Y=0" point of the pattern. This "0,0" position can vary from pattern to pattern, so the best way to reposition is by using the Area or Reposition tools from the menu.

### Quilting machine stuck in a faster speed than selected by Pro-Stitcher Lite

Stitch length is much smaller than selected; machine running faster than it should.

Something has caused the quilting machine to lock up at a higher speed (tighter SPI) than selected. Rebooting both the quilting machine and the Pro-Stitcher Lite tablet should resolve the issue.

#### No patterns or folders show up in the design library

The current path is pointing to the wrong drive letter.

Designs are stored on the computer's hard drive and on the removable USB flash drive. If you are attempting to access designs specifically on the USB flash drive, make sure the USB flash drive is plugged in securely to the Pro-Stitcher Lite tablet computer. Press Cancel if the Open screen is already open, remove the USB flash drive, wait about 15 seconds, insert the USB, and then press the **Open** button again.

The patterns that come preloaded on the Pro-Stitcher USB Flash drive are located in a folder called Designs on the USB flash drive (usually drive D:\ or E:\). From the Open window, select a drive letter by pressing on the arrow button next to the drive you wish to browse. If there is a circle with a ^ symbol on the right-hand side of the button, it means there are more folders in that particular path.

If there continues to be nothing showing up on the USB flash drive, plug it into a desktop or laptop computer and verify that the USB flash drive has the desired files on it. If the computer says it wants to reformat the flash drive, then the flash drive has gone bad and will need to be replaced. If it opens but there are no files on the flash drive, contact Pro-Stitcher for replacement files.\*

\*Pro-Stitcher highly recommends backing up all pattern files on a home computer or another disk.

### **Corrective Measure Problem/Symptom** Jumps between repeated patterns Use of any of the Repeat options results in a When using the Repeat functions, if the start and/or jump between each pattern stop points are within the block of the pattern (i.e. they are not located at the left and right-hand sides of the pattern block and/or not at the same height), there will be a jump between each repeat of the pattern. Check that the carriage is plugged in and that the serial cables are connected properly into the box behind the Pro-Stitcher Lite tablet computer. If everything is connected properly and power is on, press the lightning bolt button to attempt to reestablish communication with the motors. If this occurs during stitching (possibly due to a large electrostatic discharge (ESD) event or power surge), the Pro-Stitcher Lite will stop moving and wait for the lightning bolt icon to be pressed. If the quilting machine is still stitching at this point, press the STOP button on the handles. Pro-Stitcher Lite will not resume on its own after such a disruption for safety reasons and will require user intervention to resume stitching. When communications are reestablished by pressing the lightning bolt button, it will be necessary to reset the starting point to the position where the stitching stopped and resume stitching from that point. If the tablet touchscreen does not respond after such an ESD or surge event, it may be necessary to reboot the tablet using the power button. A mouse may be plugged in to

an available USB port and used to save any work prior

to rebooting the tablet.

Problem/Symptom	Corrective Measure
Error messages	
Buffer Underflow	If a message with the words "Buffer Underflow" appears while stitching, it is an indication that data is not getting to the motors quickly enough. This may be due to something in the tablet computer tying up the CPU. Although it may be possible to resume quilting by simply pressing the red X box to close the error message and then pressing the Motor Error lightning bolt button at the top right-hand corner of the screen, it is best to cancel the current design stitch-out, save the pattern, and reboot the computer. Use the <b>New Start Point</b> function if necessary to resume from where stitching was left off.
System Restore or System Repair message on start-up.	If a message appears on start-up (black screen, white text) that asks whether to run System Restore or Start Windows Normally, select <b>Start Windows Normally</b> .  The system should resume as normal. The computer will default to the System Restore screen (more of a typical Windows blue/white screen) if you do not select the Start Normally option in time. If this occurs, use the power switch to reboot the computer and try again.
