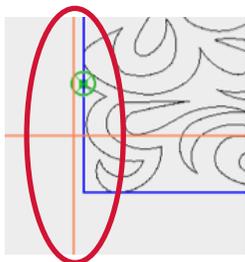
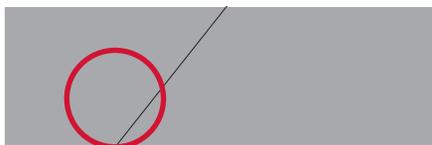


Question: I have too much design left at the bottom of my quilt. How do I crop off the bottom part of the design?

- Position the design correctly on the quilt, ready to quilt out the last row.
- Move the machine needle to the bottom of the quilt top where you want to crop on the outside of the design.

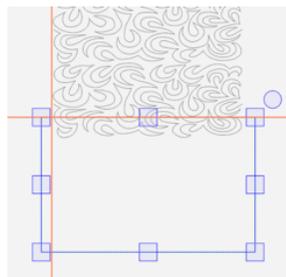


- Press the **Motors** button to lock the machine in place. This will hold your position so that you can move your area without moving the desired position of the needle.
- Select **Area** tab.
- Press **Select**. This will select the pink area and turn it to green so that you can edit it.



- Press **XForm**. (Transform) This will add handles to the area box allowing you to adjust the size and move the area.
- Select **Modify**.

- Press **Reposition**.
- With your finger drag the green area box down so that the top of the area is even with the crosshairs.

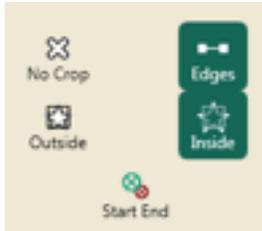


- Press **Resize**.
- With your finger touch the side handles on the area box and enlarge the width of the area.
- Press **Select** in the workspace tools.



- Select **Modify**.
- Press **Crop**.
- Press **Inside**.

- Press **Edges** if you want continuous stitching after each tie off. Each loose end created after **Crop** will be tied to the next end point by stitching along the border of the **Area** to get to the next point.



- Do not press **Edges** if you prefer to have the machine stop and tie off and then move to the next cropped start, tie on and continue.



- The design will be cropped from the inside of the area.
